Historical Background: Created by the Borough of Kingston upon Hull during the course of business regarding regulatory and administrative issues

Custodial History: Originally in the possession of the Town Clerk, transferred to Hull City Archives

Description: Byelaws made by the Mayor and Burgesses of Hull for the regulation of various aspects of civic life in Hull. Includes byelaws relating to the regulation of shipping in the haven, non-attendance of officers and refusal of officers to act, the market, and the Meters' Office for Grain and Seed.

C BRR/1	<p>Byelaw: Fines for Non-Attendance of Officers and for Refusal to Act</p> <p>Byelaw of the Mayor and Aldermen for levying fines on Aldermen for non-attendance at meetings and on persons refusing to serve as Mayor, Sheriff and other officers, and enacting that Aldermen were not to resign without consent. Confirmed by the Lord Chancellor and Lord Chief Justices, also bearing the seal of the Corporation of Hull. Note that a paper copy is also present. C BRR/2	<p>Byelaw: Shipping in the Haven</p> <p>Copy Byelaw for regulating shipping in the Haven, refers to where and when ships are allowed to lie in the harbour and sets penalty fines for those found breaking the regulations. C BRR/4	<p>Byelaw: Corn and Seed Meters' Office Regulations</p> <p>Printed byelaw regarding the regulation of the Meters' Office for Seed and Grain</p> <p>Access cannot be provided by reason of the fragile nature of this document</p> <p>1 item</p>	20 Apr 1827
C BRR/5	<p>Byelaw: Market Regulations</p> <p>Printed poster displaying rules and regulations governing the market in Hull</p> <p>1 item</p>	4 Dec 1832
