**Minutes of Hull Petty Sessions**

**1811-1835**

**Historical Background:** These courts met daily and formed the lowest tier in the English court system, now known as magistrates' courts. They dealt with minor crimes, licensing, juvenile offenders and civil matters such as bastardy, child maintenance and adoption.

**Description:** Minutes including settlement examinations and convictions
