DBFWH/1	Internment Account Book In chronological order, gives name and age of deceased, type and cost of coffin and its accessories, type and cost of hearse and any other expenses such as cards and envelopes. From 1912 the format alters to give name, age and date of death of the deceased, their address, size of coffin, its accessories, where buried or cremated, burial number, compartment number and in some instances date of funeral. 1 volume	Oct 1902- May 1939
DBFWH/2	Day Book Relating to the joinery business. Orders arranged chronologically giving name of customer and work carried out with detailed costings. Includes repairs to war damage. 1 volume	Sep1916- July 1941
DBFWH/3	Letter Book Contains copies of accounts sent for payment of work carried out, including funerals. Arranged in chronological order of the date the letter was despatched. A list of the names of the deceased is at the front of the volume (not in alphabetical order) indicating on which page the letter can be found 1 volume	Jan 1937- Sep 1942
