Historical Background: Hull has a rich fishing and maritime past and many seamen have passed through the port of Hull during its long history. Fishermen have been operating out of Hull since the 16th century.

Custodial history: Neagtives collected by Len Allen, and passed on to Peter Tomlinson, when they worked together on Hull Docks. Deposited by Karl Tomlinson, the son of Peter Tomlinson.

Description: 8 glass plate negatives, of Hull Docks, Saville Street and one unidentified location
