Historical Background: The papers relating to William Wilberforce were created by the City Of Hull to mark the 150th anniversary of his death and the abolition of the slave trade in Hull. The papers from the Labour Party were created as part of a campaign against the rising influence of the Municipal Association.

Custodial history: The file for the Labour campaign was passed to Patrick Doyle by Councillor Colin Inglis, who had received them in turn from Honorary Alderman John Atkinson in the 1980s. The Wilberforce anniversary items were collected by the Hon Alderman Doyle whilst a councillor for the City.
