This made the town the inland port of the West Riding and it was the home of many shipbuilders, vessel owners and even master mariners. Until ship registration began in Goole in 1828, ships had to register in their nearest port, which was Hull.

Custodial history: The bond was purchased by Mrs James and the letter was found in a old book also purchased by Mrs James.

Description: Bond between James Pettinger of Hessle in the County of Kingston upon Hull, mariner and Marmaduke Wadman of the Town of Kingston upon Hull, Gent. and a letter from Francis Moon of Knottingley to her husband John Moon, a mariner working out of Hull.
