Historical Background: The Bye-Laws Committee was established by the new Corporation of Hull under the 1835 Municipal Corporations Act to draw up a code of bye-laws as well as fees for the borough

Custodial history: Records created as part of the work of the Bye-Laws Committee and routinely transferred from the Town Clerks Department

Description: Tables of fees to be taken by the Clerk to the Justices and the Clerk of the Peace with related letters

Extent: 7 items
