

**C TCDP Hull Town Council Docks and Parliamentary 1858-1859
and Docks Visiting Committees**

Historical Background: The Docks and Parliamentary Committee was appointed in October 1858 to consider the corporation's response to a proposal put to it by the Hull Dock Company. After reporting back, it was wound up in September 1861. The Docks Visiting Committee seems to have run either as a committee in its own right or as a sub-committee of the Property or Docks and Parliamentary Committees, although its origins are difficult to identify.

Custodial history: Records created as part of the work of the Docks and Parliamentary and Docks Visiting Committees and routinely transferred from the Town Clerks Department
