Based on the 'Christian's Penny Magazine' the first Congregational Magazine appeared in April 1867. This monthly publication featured a range of general and local content including regular news and updates from churches across the region including detailed obituary for prominent members of the church.

Each year was given a Volume No (ie 1867 was Vol 1, 1868 Vol 2) but there appears to have been some errors in the numbering system, details provided here have not been corrected or adjusted to take into account any errors.

	From 1868 the magazine was through numbered across the year and are usually bound in yearly volumes with a table of contents for the year. Until 1878 the volume also features what is believed to be 'The Juvenile Missionary Annual' for the same year but this is unclear as the cover page has not been included. From 1909 the volume only contains the Congregational Magazine.
