A Yorkshire Scrap Book

1731-1940

Historical Background: The title and penultimate pages suggests the volume belonged to Frederick Wade Booth of Rotherham and London. The title has the date '3 January, 1849' and 'presented by AH', with the additional motto, 'multum in parvo'. The date 18 July 1849 has been written on the penultimate page.

Custodial history: Appears to have been loaned to the library by Mr Field of 77 Lowgate, Hull on 13 Jun 1940, although the title page is also inscribed landerson Smith W., 1924.

Description: Scrap book of cuttings and engravings, covering the period 1731-1792 and featuring members of the clergy, county land owners and businessmen as well as information on cities, towns and villages in Yorkshire. Additional papers contained within the volume are from a later date, 1831-1940.
