They provide detailed insight into the agenda, aims and actions of the group. The minutes begin with the names of those who were present at the meeting followed by the events of the meeting. The minutes, in conjunction with the correspondence, also provide information on the group's contacts with other groups and individuals. U DX225/1/3	<p>Correspondence sent by Hull Action for Peace</p> <p>The letters cover a wide range of areas including letters to specific members or the group about group activities (e.g. petitions), letters to prospective new members or individuals asking for support, answers to enquiries about providing speakers for events, thank you letters to supporters, answers to requests for leaflets or information about the group, letters to individuals and the council trying to generate support, letters mentioning disturbances at Hull Action for Peace meeting and events, thank yous and information on collecting signatures for the World Disarmament Campaign petition and letters relating to concern about the potential deployment of Tomahawk and Pershing 2 missiles in the UK and Western Europe. Some of the letters are incomplete and some are handwritten. U DX225/1/5	<p>Publicity Material</p> <p>Contains letters and leaflets sent to specific councillors or Hull City Council. Other leaflets cover topics such as: Polaris, 'British groups working for peace and social justice', a 'synopsis' of the activities of Hull Action for Peace over the past two years (5/2/1980), annual reports for Hull Action for Peace for the years 1978-1979 and 1979-1980, promotional material for Hull Action for Peace, promotion material produced by other groups involved in the peace movement. There is also some draft promotional material and an envelope containing black and white photographs of an anti-Polaris protest. Also contains one original and one copy of the annual report for 1980-1981 detailing the efforts and activities of Hull Action for Peace.</p> <p>1 file</p>	1979-1981

U DX225/2	<p>Peace movement ephemera</p> <p>Including:</p> <p>a) Hull Women for Peace, (5 items) - contains newsletter, publicity material by Hull Women for Peace and notes on future activities.</p> <p>b) Large poster relating to Greenham Common Women's mass demonstration, 11 December 1983. The demonstration led to an encircling of the RAF Greenham Common base involving a human chain of 50 000 women. The Greenham Common Women's Peace Camp began in September 1981 and was set up to protest against nuclear weapons being positioned at the RAF base.</p> <p>c) Publicity material including posters and notices, including Humberside Against Nuclear Dumping, Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, (5 items).</p> <p>11 items</p>	1983-1985
