Hull History Centre: Enrollment and Registration could have increased the price of bread out of proportion to rising price of grain, and thousands would have starved, or perhaps taken vengeance on the bakers.

Under the 1758 Act bakers were to mark their breads with "W" for wheaten bread and "H" for household bread. This Act also addresses the practice of selling bread made with flour adulterated with alum or made with inferior flours and then sold as a better grade of bread. For these offenses bakers could be fined and have their names published in a local newspaper.
