**Historical Background:** These records were created as part of administrative activities by various solicitors on behalf of various individuals and organisations, and by the Charity Commission. Established in around 1680, the first Unitarian Church in Hull was located on Bowlalley Lane and later moved to Park Street in 1881. The Queens Permanent Building Society operated out of Scale Lane in Hull.

Custodial history: Purchased at a car boot sale by Duncan McCollin of Northampton

**Description:** Deeds for properties in Sculcoates (1878) and Grimsby (1877), the Will of Sarah Johnson (1889) and a Charity Commission application of proceeds of sale by the Unitarian Chapel, Hull (1881).
