

C DEX Miscellaneous deposited education items 1856-1988

Historical Background: Where appropriate, any information on the historical background relating to the records is included with each entry. Records created by schools and organisations as part of their regular activities.

Custodial History: The items within C DEX have a variety of provenances. C DEX/1 was removed from 59/60 Mytongate (Corporation Property) prior to demolition. C DEX/2 were deposited by Mr E. Britnell of Beverley in 1979. C DEX/6 and C DEX/7 were a Hull Museum's deposit with reference number 71/49.

C DEX/13 was given to the Area Library, Hove, East Sussex by Mr. E. Woolgar and transferred to the Hull Central Library in 1979. They were transferred to the Record Office in March 1986. C DEX/14 had been passed to Councillor Miss. V.A. Mitchell by Mr Kemp of Hull in 1987, who then passed the items to the City Archives. C DEX/16 was deposited in 2003 by Janet Seaton, daughter of W. Cameron Walker, the headmaster of Kingston High School. C DEX/17/1-3 were deposited by Miss P. Aldabella in 1996 whilst C DEX/17/4 was deposited in January 2013.

C DEX/18 was passed to City Archives by Janet Friedlander of the National Union of Teacher's Library and Information Unit in London in 1996. Hull Museums transferred the items within C DEX/19 in 1996. C DEX/20 was deposited in 1997. West Yorkshire Archives Service in Leeds transferred the items in C DEX/21 in 2005.

C DEX/22 was deposited in 1998 by Mrs Rawding of North Ferriby via Mr. D Northmore of the City Council's Education Department. Mrs Clarke deposited C DEX/23 in 1995. C DEX/25 were initially passed to Judy Burg at the University of Hull Archives and Special Collections who then transferred them to the City Archives. C DEX/29 were deposited by Annette Shirley, the daughter of Marie Eeks, sometime secretary at Newland. C DEX/30 was deposited by Mrs Alex Thistleton. The returns at C DEX/31 were kept by the school and then passed to Hull History Centre in Dec 2015. C DEX/32 was found by builders during demolition and given to Mavis Draper who passed the volume to the History Centre in August 2017 whilst C DEX/33 was deposited in October 2017 by Robert Clark.
