

C DI 15 **Records relating to Thomas William Findlay of the Highland Light Infantry** **c.1900-c.1906**

Biographical Background: Thomas William Findlay was born in Scotland in 1876 and joined the Highland Light Infantry aged 18. He served in South Africa with the 16th Battalion between 1899-1902 (Boer War). He would go on to serve in the King's Guard at Ballater in 1908 as well as the First World War. He married Ethel Mowatt in 1946 and died in 1951 in Jersey.

Custodial history: The items were retained by his wife Ethel and passed to her sister Sarah after which they made their way to her grand daughter Elizabeth who deposited the items with the Hull History Centre.

Description: Includes: Commemorative scroll for service in the boer war, two masonic scrolls and one typed history of the Highland Light Infantry.
