W. Joseph Paxton lived on Emma's Terrace and was a stonemason. He was the great grandfather of Charles Adlard Daubney.

Notebook contains Quatermaster's notes, followed by diary entries covering the period 16 Oct 1915-9 Mar 1916. Diary entries record a journey made by ship from Bristol, through the Bay of Biscay to Alexandria, Egypt, a period spent stationed in Egypt, and return journey through the Bay of Biscay to Bristol.
