The Cape Adair and Cape Coumbia were built in the 1950s and operated until the late 1960s. All tree cape vessels were owned by Hudsons.

Custodial history: These photographs used to hang on the walls of the Ye Olde Blue Bell in Hull home to the Union One Folk Club. They were removed when the club closed and were passed to the History Centre by long time folk club member, Steve Gardham.
