Historical Background: The Horse and Jockey traded as a pub from at least 1814 until around 1908. It was demolished in the 1930s. The The Bull and Dog was built around 1780 and was renamed the Shepherd Inn in the 1830s. It was demolished in 1901.

Custodial history: Acquired by Paul Gibson, author of several publications and websites relating to public houses in Hull, and deposited in 2013
