Harrison was the assistant to the Town's Clerk, and, according to contemporary author James Sheahan, was responsible for ensuring the availability of municipal documents for consultation. Hull Corporation was granted the Manor of Tupcoates with Myton by the charter of 1552.

Custodial history: Acquired by Hull Libraries as part of the Hedley MacKay Bequest in 1927
