

L DLHR **Transcriptions and translations
of the Hull Rental of 1347** **Late 19th cent.-
Mid 20th cent.**

Historical Background: The 1347 Rental of Hull, drawn up by William de la Pole and the town's leading citizens, is significant as it gives an accurate picture of Hull at that specific time. It was maintained within Hull's Bench Books, the records of the burgesses of the town. Arthur Bromley Wilson-Barkworth (1854-1929) was a noted Hull and East Riding antiquarian. Leonard B. Stanewell (1884-1951) was the Records Clerk for Hull, and published a calendar of documents in the Hull Record Office.

Description: Manuscript and typed transcriptions and translations from the Hull Bench Book. Previous library reference L.9.7037.

Related material: The Hull Bench Book II, from which the rental has been extracted, can be located at reference, C BRE/1/1, which is available on microfilm, at roll number 173. Further copies can of the Rental be located at C DMX/213/1, whilst at C DMX/213/2 is a table showing the owners of plots in the town, compiled from notes by prepared by J.R. Boyle. Volumes compiled by Arthur Bromley Wilson-Barkworth can be found at L DLAB, whilst a search through the History Centre's indexes will produce details of the many articles written by him. Stanewell's 'Calendar of the ancient deeds, letters, miscellaneous old documents, &c., in the archives of the Corporation' can be found at L.9.7. In addition, some of the information at C TMK will have been compiled by Stanewell.
