Historical Background: Whilst in the Local Studies Library's previous location at the Hull Central Library on Albion Street these items were held in safes and the safe is identified in the description of each item. The collection also includes some material formerly held within the Local Studies book series that was deemed archival.

L SP/97, items from the collection of Thomas Mapplebeck of Hull. Thomas Mapplebeck acquired a collection of autographs and portraits of royal and other distinguished individuals. Among the most notable of these were monarchs of England, from Henry VII to Queen Victoria much of which went to auction in London in 1891. Despite this a small number of items from the collection found its way into the possession of Hull Local Studies Library.

Custodial history: Items were acquired/ deposited over several decades with the Local Studies Library when it was housed at the Central Library, Albion Street, Hull.

Description: The collection is comprised of items from the special collections held at the Hull Local Studies Library. Items are varied in nature.
