Historical Background:

John Nicholson ("Nicky"), who became Principal in 1935, led the campaign for the College's independence. This was achieved on 13 May 1954 when a Royal Charter was granted and the University of Hull was given the right to award its own degrees. Lord Middleton was installed as the University of Hull's first Chancellor in July 1955. The number of applications doubled within a year, and in 1956, the student population topped 1,000 for the first time.
