Ottringham School

1858

Ottringham is 12 miles south east from Hull. It is thought that there were two schools in Ottringham at this time. A small free school accommodating 20 children and The National School erected in the late 1830s which held up to 100 children. From the information available it is not possible to indicate which of these schools the material relates to. 2 items

Exercise book by Bride Hodgson

1858

The book contains various mathematical problems divided into subjects using decorative subtitles painted in bright colours. The problems explore each subject using various scenarios and practical examples of calculations under titles such as, "Profit and Loss", "Exchange" and "Land Surveying." "Exchange" for example, uses exchange rates to calculate the value of currency from various European countries such as France, Spain, Italy, Portugal, Holland, Flanders, Germany and Ireland.

U DX326/2/2

Exercise book by Bride Hodgson

[1858]

This book contains no date but appears to follow on from U DX326/1. On the first page it states that Bride Hodgson is twelve years old. It begins with the last subject from the previous book, "Land Surveying" and describes the rest of the information as "Miscellaneous Questions" in which there are various problems and calculations regarding scenarios such as the measuring of land or timber. The books also contains carefully painted examples of various shapes along with relevant calculations. One problem uses an address which could be the authors' [father] "Mr Hodgsons, Coats Close, Ottringham." On the last page of the book there is a rudimentary map showing continents and oceans.
