Biographical Background:

Arthur George Morrison was born 1 Nov 1863 in East London. In 1890 he joined the editorial staff at the *Globe* newspaper and the following year saw the publication of his first stories. His detective series based in East London and featuring his lead character Martin Newitt was a clear imitation of Arthur Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes. *A Child of the Jago*, published in 1896, provides a graphic account of both the living conditions and the propensity to violence. He died on 4 Dec 1945 and is buried in the churchyard at High Beach.
